Youth

399 kids and 140 teen participants for a total of 537, up from 254 kids and 43 teens from last year.
1647 kids and 860 teen submissions were received, up from 627 kids and 232 teens from last year.

Approximately 350 patrons attended our kick-off party and 160 patrons attended the Grand Finale pool party at Shore Acres.

Thank you to the members of the Kids Advisory Board and the Teen Advisory Board for their suggestions for programming and prizes. We listened to their suggestions for the themes of the ten gift baskets, and they were a huge hit!

Adult

133 adults participated in summer reading, up from 94 adults the year before.
596 adult reading entries were submitted, up from 406 adult submissions the year before.

Each Monday of summer reading, five \$15 gift certificates to local businesses were awarded. At the end of the month, three \$50 grand prize winners were selected from all of the adult tickets submitted.




Page Turners Book Club Thursday, August 1, 1:00p






